

HARSH IS AN AWARD-WINNING RESEARCHER, ENGINEER, DEVELOPER AND DATA SCIENTIST POWERING CROSS-SECTOR INNOVATION IN HEALTHCARE, BIOTECHNOLOGY AND ARTIFICIAL INTELLIGENCE.

Before university, Harsh researched a salivary biomarker and proposed a point-of-care test for the early detection of pancreatic cancer, earning him recognition as a 2020 We Are Family Foundation Global Teen Leader, a 2021 Rise Global Winner and the Bal Shakti Puraskar recipient — the highest civilian honor bestowed by the President of India to individuals under 18. He then pursued a gap year where he served as the lead data scientist at Paraswap, a decentralized crypto exchange aggregator. Harsh developed their primary integrated dashboard, which processed transactions worth over \$45 billion across multiple blockchains. He is currently implementing and openly developing Atom51, a protein programming language designed to enable therapies that can perform substantially more complex tasks than current small-molecule drugs. Harsh's approach involves exploring a unified structure-sequence and function-based pretraining of protein models using Energy-Based Models, diverging from the probabilistic auto-regressive modeling popularized by Large Language Models (LLMs) like ChatGPT. His long-term goal is to turn his current project into a formal venture that would carry out therapeutic design with a completely firstprinciples approach by leveraging computational biology. Today, he is a freshman at Imperial College London, pursuing a Master of Engineering (MEng) in Molecular Bioengineering.

In 2017, he also founded Startupistan—a tech and entrepreneurship ecosystem platform for youth in Afghanistan. Over the past eight years, Mozamel's initiatives and ventures have successfully assisted over 5,000 individuals in breaking into the tech industry. He actively engages with stakeholders from both sectors to develop innovative solutions that foster a more inclusive and techempowered workforce. DIANA IS A FIRST-GENERATION BUYI CHINESE-AMERICAN IMMIGRANT AND FOUNDER OF LETTERS TO STRANGERS, THE LARGEST YOUTH-TO-YOUTH MENTAL HEALTH NONPROFIT ORGANIZATION IN THE WORLD.

Diana founded Letters to Strangers (L2S) when she was a sophomore in high school after bipolar disorder and a blinding eye condition nearly ended her life. By beginning to heal through letters, she discovered that writing is humanity distilled into ink. Today, L2S is the largest global youth-for-youth mental health nonprofit, exchanging 60,000+ letters and impacting over 500,000 people on six continents in over 70 countries over the last 10 years. L2S published the world's first youth-for-youth mental health guidebook for free, currently taught in schools worldwide, and also operates the first toll-free 24/7 pan-African mental health hotline out of its nationally-recognized Liberia office. Now, she is committed to partnering with private sector leaders to raise awareness about mental health in business environments and ensure the wellbeing of young people in the workplace. In addition to being a 2017 We Are Family Foundation Global Teen Leader, Diana was honored by two U.S. Presidents at the White House and named a 2021 Princess Diana Legacy Award Winner and 2020 L'Oréal Paris Woman of Worth. She was also a part of Adobe's inaugural cohort of Global Top Talent in 2019 for her work as a conceptual photographer, having been published by Vogue Italia and exhibited to over 72,000 people. Diana graduated from Princeton University in 2021 with Honors and pivoted from her previous experience as a NASA astrophysicist and UN Intergovernmental Panel on Climate Change researcher to now pursue a fully-funded MBA at the University of Oxford as a Skoll Scholar. Having grown up below the poverty line with parents who don't speak English, she learned firsthand how healing and growth is a non-linear process that no one should have to approach alone.

TANVI BRINGS CROSS-SECTOR LEADERS TOGETHER TO WORK ON THE EQUITABLE PARTICIPATION OF WOMEN AND YOUNG PEOPLE IN SPACES OF POWER.

A Muhammad Ali Award recipient, Tanvi founded the Becoming I Foundation — a youthled movement that works closely with government, nonprofit and private players to rethink education systems in India. Under her leadership, Becoming I grew from five team members in New Delhi to thousands of volunteers across four states. Owing to her lived experience as an Indian woman and the challenges she faced at different stages of her leadership, Tanvi has followed her frustration about the state of women's education, leadership development and participation in the workplace. She is the Vice Chair, Board of Directors of Fora, a global center of excellence for young women's leadership, and the National Advisor at GirlTrek, America's largest health movement for black women. Tanvi is also the founder and Principal Consultant at Enable, where she works as an advisor, trainer and coach to mission-oriented business, political and social leaders across the globe, focusing on building their capacity as values-based leaders to build better companies, organizations and communities where everyone can belong and thrive. She is a visiting faculty at Harvard University, where her teaching focuses on authentic leadership and storytelling for action. Tanvi is a 2010 We Are Family Foundation Global Teen Leader, was awarded the William J. Clinton Fellowship and has been invited to speak at the UN ECOSOC, UN WOMEN, the Clinton Global Initiative and at various TEDx conferences, alongside heads of state, social and business leaders.


LIAM IS AN AWARD-WINNING SOCIAL ENTREPRENEUR WHO HAS WORKED ACROSS PUBLIC & PRIVATE SECTORS TO ACHIEVE RECORDLOW YOUTH UNEMPLOYMENT RATES IN RURAL NEW ZEALAND.

Growing up in a rural community called Horowhenua, Liam was dissatisfied with Horowhenua having one of New Zealand's highest youth unemployment rates at 25.9%. In 2014, at the age of 14, he founded what is now known as Get-Go, Horowhenua's youth employment platform. Between 2014 and 2021, Liam worked deeply at the interface of young people, employers and the education and welfare systems, raising over \$800,000 of investment to drive employment initiatives that have engaged thousands and supported many into employment. Nearly a decade later, Horowhenua's youth unemployment rate is now 14.5% — the lowest since records began. He received local civic recognition and regional and national awards for his leadership and contribution to this important area. Liam has years of experience in strategic and operational roles working across the public, private and community sectors, where he knows how forming cross-sector partnerships is a key enabler in achieving meaningful change. He has held a range of youth advisory roles and governance appointments across the public and not-for-profit sectors over the last eight years, including to former New Zealand Prime Minister Chris Hipkins when he was appointed Minister of Education in 2017. Today, Liam is a Senior Associate in PwC New Zealand's Management Consulting Practice, supporting clients across the public, private and community sectors in the areas of strategy, operations, transformation and social equity. He is also a 2020 We Are Family Foundation Global Teen Leader and the Deputy Board Chair of Student Job Search New Zealand's national student employment and early career agency.



HAYAT IS AN EDUCATION EQUITY ACTIVIST CHAMPIONING GLOBAL DEVELOPMENT AND LEVERAGING TECHNOLOGY FOR SOCIAL CHANGE THROUGH THE YOUTH-POWERED ORGANIZATION KOW IYO LABO.

In 2018, Hayat co-founded Kow iyo Labo — a youth education reform organization born from her personal struggles within the education system and a firsthand witnessing of inherent inequities. Kow iyo Labo is also involved in advocating for education equity policies and reforms, lobbying legislators and working with experts to craft laws that will help get educational resources to communities that need them most. In 2019, Kow iyo Labo established Minnesota's first student education advisory board. Hayat has also ventured into the international arena as a researcher at the Indonesia Bureau of Economic Research, where she explored sustainable finance using Islamic economic frameworks. Her work has earned her recognition as a 2020 We Are Family Foundation Global Teen Leader, a Daily Point of Light Award Honoree, a Women of the World Festival 40 Leading Young Activist, a 2021 Coca-Cola Scholar and a Changemaker at Home by the Minneapolis Department of Civil Rights. Hayat is also a student at Harvard University. Through her multifaceted efforts, she remains steadfast in her commitment to driving positive change through technology and addressing systemic challenges in education and global development.



Sneha is the Founder and President of Encode Justice, the leading youth movement for human-centered Artificial Intelligence (AI). Through her work at Encode Justice, Sneha helped support the White House's work on developing an Al Bill of Rights and an Al executive order and has overseen a workshop program that has reached over 30,000 high school and college students globally. She has been invited to represent Encode Justice at the White House eight times, including as the youngest civil society leader at an Al roundtable with Vice President Harris. Sneha has also personally advised other national and international stakeholders like the United Nations Interregional Crime and Justice Research Institute, INTERPOL, the European Commission, the U.S. Department of Education and the U.S. Federal Trade Commission. At WEF24, she hopes to plug into global consensus-building conversations about Al regulation. Described as the Greta Thunberg of Al in POLITICO, Sneha was most recently the youngest individual named to TIME's list of the 100 Most Influential Voices in Al and the youngest member of Mozilla's list of the 25 Rising Stars Shaping Our Digital Future. Her work has been covered in CNN, the Washington Post, The Guardian, POLITICO, CNBC, Reuters, MIT Technology Review, Teen Vogue, Wired, The Hill and more. Born and raised in the heart of Silicon Valley, Sneha is also a second-year at Williams College studying political science and economics, a former fellow at the Center for Al and Digital Policy and a 2021 We Are Family Foundation Youth To The Front Fund Frontliner.

ITALO IS A SOCIAL ENTREPRENEUR & A HUMANITARIAN WORKER AT THE UNITED NATIONS ADDRESSING CLIMATE CHANGE FORCED DISPLACEMENT.

Italo is also the Co-Founder of TODXS, a nonprofit/social business committed to the economic activation of the LGBTIQ+ community in Brazil through job placement, entrepreneurship, leadership development and corporate consulting. In 2019, he joined forces with national human rights and advocacy organizations to pressure the Supreme Court for the legalization of blood donation by LGBTQI+ people and to criminalize LGBTphobia in Brazil both cases making history in Brazil. As a humanitarian worker at the United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees in Brasília, Italo has responded to the Venezuelan, Haitian and Afghan forced displacement crises. He has also worked at the Brazilian government and at Deloitte & Touche as an Advisory Consultant in New York City. Currently, he is pursuing a PhD in Peace and Conflict studies at the University for Peace in Costa Rica, where he is proposing the adoption of legal regional pathways to extend international protection to climate change forcibly displaced individuals. While growing up in Grande Bom Jardim, one of the most socially and economically deprived communities in Brazil, Italo witnessed and experienced the consequences of gang and domestic violence and abuse, poverty and poor access to basic public services. He held on to public education as the only way out of the perpetuating cycle of inequality that his family had been immersed in for decades. He now has an MBA from the University of São Paulo, a Master's degree in global affairs from Tsinghua University in China and a Bachelor's in international business from Quinnipiac University in the United States. He is a 2012 We Are Family Foundation Global Teen Leader, a One Young World Ambassador, a Schwarzman Scholar and a WEF Global Shaper.

DAVID IS A CLIMATE CHANGE COMMUNICATOR AND THE DEPUTY HEAD OF THE UK GOVERNMENT INTERNATIONAL FOREST UNIT.

David led the nature campaign for the COP26 climate conference in Glasgow, which resulted in 145 world leaders committing to halt and reverse forest loss by 2030. To ensure this commitment went beyond words, David instigated new partnerships to tackle the largest drivers of deforestation, such as food system emissions, and mobilized over \$12 billion in public and private sector finance. He now works to ensure these ambitions are delivered in a way that promotes sustainable development for people as well as nature and climate. This role continues David's 18 years of work on climate change, leading efforts within governments and businesses to establish and deliver Net Zero ambitions. As a teenage campaigner, after experiencing the impacts of climate change in his hometown, he persuaded the Prime Minister to put climate change on the UK school curriculum and has since led global efforts to expand climate education and engage the public via TEDx talks, innovative events and media campaigns in over 15 countries. Before David joined the UK Government, he was a consultant advising countless governments and businesses on sustainability strategy, and he worked for the UNFCCC for COP21, helping to embed public engagement and the role of young leaders within the Paris Agreement. In 2023, David joined the board of trustees for the Woodland Trust, the UK's largest conservation NGO, which is committed to protecting, restoring and creating woods and trees for a healthy people and planet. In addition to being a 2008 Global Teen Leader Alum, he is now also a trustee for Nile Rodgers' We Are Family Foundation, supporting game-changing youth innovators to amplify their impact. David is also a goalkeeper for the Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation and a Fellow of the Royal Geographical Society and Durham University.
